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
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Editor's Note

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
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



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Caravan-e-Sattal Five Days of Birding, Brotherhood, and Beautiful Sightings

When five passionate photographers from Jaipur and Jodhpur loaded their cameras and binoculars into a car and set off for the hills of Uttarakhand, they were not merely embarking on a birdwatching trip, they were undertaking a journey of discovery, friendship, and photographic fulfilment. The destination: Sattal. The mission: to explore, to observe, and to capture some of the most exquisite avian life in India. They called it "Caravan-e-Sattal"- a five-day odyssey into one of the subcontinent's richest birding havens.


Sattal: Where the Forests Sing

Nestled in the lower Kumaon Himalayas, near Nainital, **Sattal** (literally "Seven Lakes") sits at an altitude of around 1,370 metres. The region is blanketed with dense oak and pine forests and is dotted with seven interconnected freshwater lakes. Its unique ecosystem, lying at the confluence of subtropical and temperate zones, makes it a biodiversity hotspot. It is no surprise that Sattal is regarded as one of the finest birding destinations in India.

With over **500 bird species** documented in the area, Sattal offers a rare confluence of accessibility and diversity. For bird photographers, it is an open-air studio where every turn of the trail might reveal a new subject-be it a gliding raptor, a perched songbird, or a flash of colour darting through the undergrowth.

Fifty Species, One Rare Mammal, and Countless Moments

Over five days of immersive exploration, the group spotted and photographed around 50 bird species. Each morning began early, with cameras ready and ears tuned to the rustle of wings and the call of the forest. Bird hides, jungle trails, and lakeside paths all became part of their moving basecamp.

Among the standout sightings was the Long-tailed Broadbill, often referred to as the Helmet Bird due to its distinctive head shape and brilliant plumage. This vibrant and somewhat comical-looking bird is considered a rare find and for the group, it was a thrilling highlight.

In an unexpected twist, the photographers also caught a brief glimpse of a **Yellow-throated Marten**, a carnivorous mammal rarely seen in the open. Agile, elusive, and almost mythical in its rarity, the sighting of the Marten added a layer of excitement that few birding trips can claim.

Other key species observed and photographed included:

- Khalij Pheasant (Lophura leucomelanos) its iridescent black plumage shimmering in the forest light
- Grey-headed Woodpecker, Rufous-bellied Woodpecker, and Himalayan Flamebackrepresenting the region's rich diversity of woodpeckers.
- Common Kingfisher, White-throated Kingfisher, and Crested Kingfisher - each a jewel beside the water
- Oriental Turtle Dove, and Wedged Tailed Green Pigeon - peaceful yet elusive in the foliage
- Plum-headed Parakeet and Slaty-headed Parakeet their vibrant greens standing out against the forest canopy
- Great Barbet: loud, colourful, and distinctly photogenic
- Oriental White-eye, a tiny yellow passerine with a curious personality
- Verditer Flycatcher, Red-billed Leiothrix, Greentailed Sunbird, and Grey Bushchat - smaller birds that brought joy in quieter, unexpected moments.



Street Faces: Capturing Urban Humanity

The "Street Faces" walk led participants into the heart of Jaipur's bustling streets, where every glance, wrinkle, and smile became a canvas of stories. Amidst the honking rickshaws, colourful shops, and chai stalls, photographers captured raw human moments - a vendor's tired yet warm smile, a child peeking curiously from behind a cart, an elder lost in thought by a temple gate.

These portraits weren't posed; they were spontaneous, full of emotion, and set against the ever-changing light and rhythm of the city. The contrast of tradition and modern life added depth, where turbans met traffic, and old havelis framed candid laughter. Through light, shadow, and expression, the walk reminded us that sometimes, the most powerful images are found in the most ordinary moments.





Mandir Ki Chaanv: Sacred Shadows

"Sacred Shadows (Mandir Ki Chaanv)" led photographers through Jaipur's ancient temples, capturing the interplay of light and shadow in sacred spaces. The soft glow of oil lamps, intricate carvings bathed in dappled sunlight, and devotees in silent prayer created a serene atmosphere. Participants focused on the subtle nuances: the flicker of a diya, the gentle folds of a priest's robe, the quiet corners where spirituality and solitude converge.



Community Engagement & Artistic Growth

These photo walks were more than just photographic excursions; they were communal experiences fostering learning and connection. Seasoned photographers mentored novices, sharing insights on composition, lighting, and storytelling. Discussions post-walk allowed participants to reflect on their experiences, critique each other's work, and build lasting relationships within the photography community.

The Chitra Tahal series exemplifies JPC's commitment to blending artistic exploration with community building.

BEST BUDGET 35MM LENS FOR SONY E-MOUNT SHOOTERS



Sony's E-mount mirror system camera users sometimes find themselves hunting for a robust 35mm lens that features good performance combined with a fair price. There are numerous good lenses available today that appeal to professionals at premium prices, yet there are one or two in the budget group that stand tall. One is the Samyang AF 35mm f/1.8 FE.

The 35mm focal length is perhaps the most versatile available for everyday use. It closely replicates the natural angle of the human eye, making it perfect for a host of genres ranging from street and portrait work to travel and lifestyle photography.





One of the major strengths of the Samyang 35mm f/1.8 is its autofocus mechanism. Driven by a stepping motor (STM), it provides speedy and nearly silent autofocus, which makes it a great lens not just for photographers but also for videographers. Tipping the scales at less than 200 grams, the lens is highly portable and balances well with Sony's small mirrorless bodies.

In summary, Samyang AF 35mm f/1.8 FE is a clever and affordable investment option for Sony E-mount shooters. It provides quick and sure autofocus, outstanding images, and compact, rugged build that's suitable for any occasion. For videographers looking to get the top value 35mm lens that does not break the bank yet still retains main features, then this lens has got to rank among the leaders in today's market.

HANDS-ON REVIEW: HOW THE CANON POWERSHOT VI PERFORMS?

Canon's PowerShot V1 is an exciting mix of retro and hightech, with retro compacto design fused with modern specifications for enthusiasts and professionals. While mirrorless cameras are the darlings of the market today, the V1 is for those who want the convenience of a model from yesteryear without compromising the very basics of image quality.

In its aesthetic, the V1 brings to mind an old-timey look at Canon's pre-2000s point-and-shoot range. Pocket-size and minimalist, the V1 is extremely easy to use for point-and-shooters. While it'll miss pro gear's interchangeable lenses and big sensors, the PowerShot V1 is intended to be simple, lightweight, and make-do-esque - a convenient on-the-run camera companion.

Internally, it has a extremely small sensor when it comes to volume but efficient as it were when it comes to working and delivers decent output in light. Natural colours and high-level detailing are adequate enough for a machine this small-sized. It's no performer low-light conditions though, but good enough for shooting on a regular basis.

The V1 is a master of simplicity. It has straightforward controls, and its menu system is neat - ideal for newcomers or shooters on the run from complicated setups. Autofocus is sufficiently fast for static subjects and rudimentary shooting conditions, and the included zoom lens provides ease of use when composing a mix of shots, ranging from street to family get-togethers.

One of the most, if not more, expected qualities of it is battery life. The V1 has a lot of life on one charge, so photographers can shoot their day without concern that they will have to be constantly running back and forth to the charger. There are video features included, but it is certainly more photographically biased in what it can do.

On balance, the Canon PowerShot V1 is not for the pixel-peeping aficionado, but that is hardly the point. It is for the ordinary chap who wants convenience, looks, and hassle-free shooting. Snapping holidays or sneaking on-the-spot portraits, the V1 provides a decent, vintage-style option that simply gets the job done and does not look half bad doing it.





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
